He was also on General Couch's staff for several months, and was stationed at this place at the close of the war. Last spring he was appointed a Lieutenant in the regular army. About the last of June, he was ordered to his regiment at Mobile, Ala., where, on the second day after his arrival, he was sent to the hospital with the fever. On the 26th of August, he was brought home to his young family almost a skeleton where he lingered until the 3d.

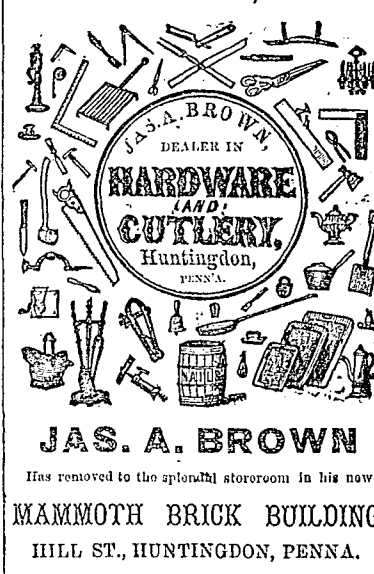
