Attention, Discharged Soldiers ! The Act of Congress approved July 28, 1866, gives atton additional bounty to all soldiers who entisted for three years and were discharged by reason of expination of service, or who were discharged for wounds received no stattle and who have not received more than \$100 bounty for such service. An additional bounty of \$100 is also allowed to the nearest relative of soldiers who entisted for a term of three years and who died or were killed in the service, to be paid in the following order: First, to the widow; second, to the children; third, to the father, and fourth, to the mother.

Soldiers' Widows. By applying to W. H. Persons who have been deprived of their pensions in
consequence of being in the civil service of the United
States Government, can be restored to the pension roll by States Government, can be resorted to the pension of applying to me.

Fathers and mothers who were in whole or in part dependent upon their sons for support are entitled to a pension. Also brothers and sisters under sixteen years of ago. All discharged soldiers who did not receive transportation to their places of enlistment when discharged, are entitled to receive the rate of war, and did not receive commutation of rations when released or discharged, are entitled to it.

Officers who were in the service on the 3d of March, 1865, and were discharged after the 9th of April, 1865, by applying to me can receive three months extra pay.

Local Bounty.

All veteran soldiers who gave their credit to districts in the State of Pennsylvania, and who received no local bounty, are entitled to receive three hundred dollars.
