Attention, Discharged Soldiers I The Act of Congress approved July 28, 1866, gives \$100 additional bounty to all soldiers who enliated for three years and were discharged by reason of expiration of service, or who were discharged for wounds received in stattle and who have not received more than \$100 bounty for such service. An additional bounty of \$100 is also allowed to the nearest relative of soldiers who enlisted for a term of three years and who died or were killed in the service, to be paid in the following order: First, to the widow; second, to the children; third, to the father, and fourth, to the mother.




