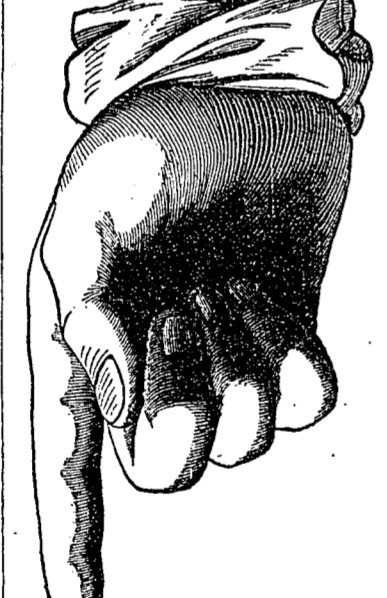

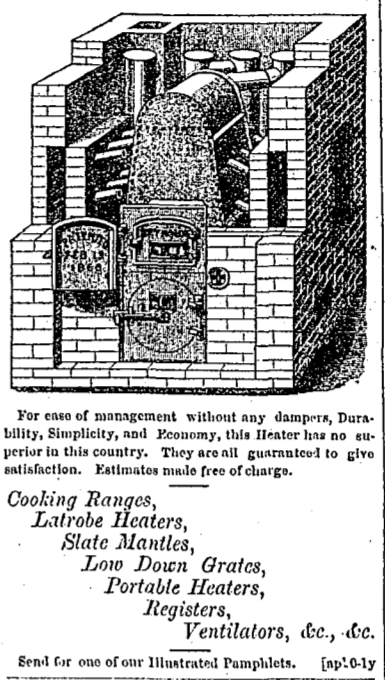
**PHOTOGRAPH

Hitherto there has been nothing introduced in way of
a Marriage Certificate that has excited any interest or at-
tention; but the originator of the PHOTOGRAPH MARRIAGE

Size and Plan of the Marriage Certificate.
