"A horse in the depot at Woodwich had proved so umanageable to the rough riders that at- length no one among them durst even mount him .-His mode of throwing or dismounting his rider consisted in lying down and rolling over him, or else crushing his leg against some wall, or post, or paling. Facts in Fruit Culture .- Dr. Trimble of Newark, New Jersey, who has paid great attention to fruit culture, gives the following as his view-the result of many years experience:

1. The most successful way to conquer the cureulio is to gather the fruit Horse Nails, and all kinds of Iron & Steel as it falls and food it to the stock to dostroy it, as it is by this fallen, fruit that the curculio propagates its spe-

2. That the fruit of the apple tree can be prevented from the apple moth by wrapping around each tree two or three times a rope made of straw. The moths will harbor in this rope and can then be destroyed.

3. That the only way to kill th peach tree borer is to cut him out with a knife, not once only in a season, but to follow him up every two weeks until exterminated. After the first "going over" of an orchard this will be little or no trouble, as each tree can be attended to in two minutes.

_ To Keep Ice from Melting -A German chemist publishes the following simple method of preserving small quantities of ice, which he has practiced with success: Put the ice into a deep dish, cover it with a plate, and put the dish on a pillow stuffed with feathers, and cover the top carefully with another pillow, and by this means exclude the external air. Feathers are well known non-conductors of heat, and in consequence the ice is prevented from melting. He also states that he has thus preserved six pounds of ice for eight days. The plan is simple, and within the reach of every house-

The Agricultural Department, in its report for October, estimates the yield of Wheat for the year in the whole country at 220,000,000 bushels, being about fifty million bushels more than last year. The yield of Oats is more than 28,000,000 bushels-three per cent. more than last year; Rye, 21,000,000-four per cent. more; Barley, 500,000 bushels-four per cent. decline; Corn, is estimated at more than an average crop; Sorghum has also declined; Buchwheat, Potatoes and Tobacco are short; Sugar has in creased twenty per cent.; Cotton is esmated at 2,500,000 bales.

Allowing it to run slowly from one ves sel into another, over a platform, covered with oak shavings, will hasten the process. A few drops of red cabbage water, will make the color deeper red, if people desire it.


