



Tho mode of using the "Solar Watch" is the simplest that can be devised. After screwing the Style or Unomon in its place in the movemble brass head and setting it directly over the straight line corresponding to the date, or that nearest to it on the cylinder, the instrument is placed apright in the sunshine in such a position as will throw the shadow of the 'tyte directly upon the line under it. After placing the plumb-line, by means of its brass attachiment, at a right angle with and to the left of the Style, in order to set the cylinder perfectly level, the point where the extremity of the shadow falls, and its distance from any of the wavy or cross lines exhibiting the morning and corresponding afternous hours, will in clicate the true time of day.
