We regret to learn that the wife of Senator McIntyre died at her home in New York, Tuesday, February 24, 1869.

At eighty-two miles a gap yet remain between the approaching termini of the Central and Union Pacific Railroads. Only a month or two, and a continuous rail will span the continent.

Joseph J. Ross, Esq., having resigned the office of Collector of Internal Revenue for the Seventeenth District of Pennsylvania, Samuel J. Ross, Esq., was on Thursday, nominated to the Senate as his successor.
