On the Oaks day a terrific thunderstorm burst over London and a large part of England causing much destruction of property and the loss of many lives. mid-summer extensivo fires broke out in the moors of Yorkshire which laid many thousands of acres of land waste and destroyed stock and game. The great heat caused an early harvest in Great Britain, but labor had to be suspended during the heat of the day, and many deaths from sunstroke occurred. Excessive heat and drought prevailed in Russia, the United States and Canada, and the deaths from sunstroke in these places were greater than was ever known. In Europe vast tracts of forests in Esthonia and Livonia were ravaged by fire, and near Riga the sky was darkened by smoke for several weeks. It was not until the month of September that the Ruglish pastures were refreshed by a plentiful supply of rain; but when it came the heated earth put forth its verdure with extraordinary rapidity. During the year very disastrous inundations occurred in France, Switzerland and Italy.


