HURRYGRAPHS.

During the last Congress, the number of bills introduced in the House was two thousand, five hundred, and in the Senate one hundred and eighty. The oldest house in the United States retaining its original form is to be found in Neponset, Mass. It was built by John Minot about the year 1640, and is still in good repair.

There is a house in Chichester, N. H., known as the "Steel house," which is 130 years old. Mrs. Stoll, 84 years of age, is now living in a room of the house in which she was born.

Robert B. Randolph, who in 1832 was dismissed from the navy by President Jackson, and who pulled the General's nose in retaliation, recently died in Washington, aged seventy-eight years.

There is said to be over two hundred houses of ironing machines in the United States. One of them was in a convention of editors recently held in Cairo, Ill., in the person of a bellicose delegate.

It is said that 700,000 persons are employed in Europe in getting out of the bowels of the earth. Of these 300,000 are in Great Britain, 100,000 in Belgium and France, 80,000 in Prussia, and the rest scattered over the other countries.

Vesuvius, according to the journals of Naples, has not returned to the quiet state which usually follows extensive eruptions. Columns of smoke are still rising from the craters and fissures. The lava is still warm, though no eruption has taken place for over a month.

An Association of about four hundred Bohemians in Chicago have sent a committee to Minnesota, in order to select a locality in that State for a settlement. The Association expect an increase of about six hundred persons from their native country during the summer.

The English Parliament is investigating the Sunday sale of newspapers in the kingdom, and think of compelling the Sunday paper proprietors to publish on Saturday. Six thousand persons are employed in the traffic in London every Sunday.

The German astronomer Maudslar has measured the height of 1,983 mountains in the moon. Twenty-two of these are under 100 feet high, and which is within a few feet of being three miles high; six are about 10,000 feet. The highest observed mountain in the moon is 24,844 feet high.

Among the aristocratic equestrians in Hyde Park, London, recently, was a man dressed as a girl of the period, who rode on a saddle, and down the part of a woman to perfection. The police took no notice of him, although he made his appearance daily for upward of a week.

A sporting man in Paris has opened an office for advising inexperienced young men in regard to so-called "fairs of honor." He teaches them 50 francs how to insult their adversaries in the most genteel manner, and how to resent affronts so as to render a duel inevitable. He instructs them also in all matters relating to "duels and challenges." He is well paid for his services.

An editor in Hampshire says that the recent auroral display of Thursday evening was as if "some colossal meteor had unrolled two or three dozen pieces of silk of the most beautiful tints of purple, green, blue, lilac, and white, gathering the ends into his hand at the zenith, and let them flow down to the horizon." The editor was formerly a dry-goods clerk, we presume.

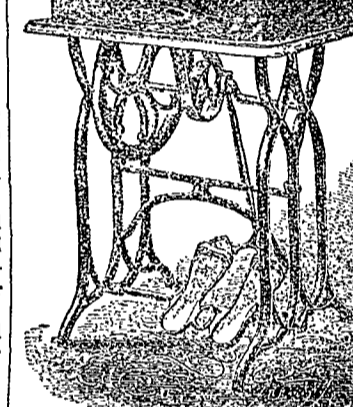
