

Short Rules in Rural Economy.

Paint all tools exposed to the weather, and if with a light colored paint, they will not heat, warp or crack the loast in the sum.

Dip well sensoned shingles in a lime wash, and dry them before laying, and they will last much longer and not become covered with moss.

In hitching a horse to a common rail or worm fonce, always select the inside corner, which will be more secure by its bracing position, and the halter will not become entangled in the projecting ends of the rails, as when hitched on the outside corner.

Always tie a halter, by making first a single loop and then thrusting the end of the halter through this loop.

This is quickly untied, and, will never come untied of itself.






