Onions must be stored before the frost. If in small quantities, they can be tied on straws, or plaited together with their stems, and deposited in the aforesaid brick oven, where the spring will find them as fresh as in autumn. In larger quantities, they can be kept in the barn until in danger of freezing, then stored in barrels in the cellar.-An old Shaker told us that they let theirs freeze stiff in the barn, and in the spring they would grow just as well. When needed for use, they at living prices. thawed them in cold water.

Carrots, beets and parsnips should be gathered early, while their juices are in their prime. They are best kept in layers of dry sand, covering a thick layer over the top of the box. Stored in this way, all their freshness is retained.

Cabbages can be planted out all round the sides of the cellar, and will grow during the winter; or remove the outer leaves, and store in boxes or barrels. Kept in pits, dug below the action of the frost, they will come out in the spring white as celery, and much fresher than those stored in the cellar.-Exchange.






