Economy in Seed Planting.

Experiments have recently tended to prove that roots and grains, by being planted much farther apart than is usual, will actually yield larger crops than are now obtained. This has been shown to be the case with potatoes, and more recently with wheat. It is found that the wheat plant increases above the ground in proportion as its roots have room to develop without interference with those of its neighbor. In one experiment wheat thus treated furnished ears containing over 120 grains. It was found in the course of the same experiments that on every fully developed cereal plant there is one superior to the rest; and that each ear has one grain which, when planted, will be more productive than any other. By selecting, therefore, the best grain of the best ear, and continuing the experiment through several generations, a point will be reached beyond which further improvement is impossible and a fixed and permanent type remains as the final result.

Who Should Have it.

"It is said when mechanics have land they generally give it better cultivation than farmers, and consequently have more grapes, pears, strawberries and water melons, and earlier potatoes and cucumbers. They devote more care and labor to a small space, and reap a larger profit from it."

If any one will look at the immense crops a very small garden will produce for a family, and compare it with the little crops from very large farms, they should need no better inducement to enrich their soil highly.

The great point to remember is this, that labor is the great item in farming; but that it takes more labor to farm rich ground than poor ground. We have, as it were double crops with the same single labor.

Thinning Out Fruit.

Thin out the pears which they over-bear, removing every knotty and wormy specimen. There are some varieties that grow in clusters, and do not generally over-bear—from these the wormy or worthless ones only should be removed; but where the tree is not too large to manage, and are not cluster-growing, no two specimens should be allowed to touch, as they are almost certain to become wormy and both are lost. Many persons, not acquainted with fruit raising, hesitate to thin out their trees, on the ground that the crop may be diminished. This may be possible but not positively true, if the fruit is intended to be fed by the pigs. But even should it be otherwise true sometimes, who would not prefer to have one bushel of large, beautiful, luscious pears, to five bushels with probably not a half a peck among them? Turnips Among Corn.

A correspondent says: It is frequently the case that in passing through corn-fields in autumn, we find space between the rows occupied with sturdy weeds, sometimes the spurious vegetation completely overtops the maize, and "casts it into the shade." Now, I would inquire, is it not much better and more prudent, in every sense of the word, for the farmer to occupy the soil monopolized by the exhaust-weeds with some crop that will contribute to his resources, than to have it filled with such production, and which will not only "sap the land" most wretchedly, but foul it by the dissemination of their minute and multitudinous seeds? Certainly no farmer can doubt the affirmative. By sowing the purple-top turnip seed at the last dressing of the corn crop, and "seeding" it in or sowing just before a rain and allowing that to cover it, he can have a hundred bushels of good turnips per acre, if the soil is rich and well cultivated, instead of a host of worthless and pestilent weeds.

Where the Flies Come From.

Flies will soon be abundant, and most people wonder where they come from. Our readers, if they remember the following paragraph, can answer the inquiry: "The eggs of the house fly are laid in decaying matter, such as dead leaves, and especially in the manure of stables; about seventy or eighty being the usual number. These soon hatch, and the larvae grows rapidly, feeding upon the substances found near it. After a short time the outer skin hardens, and becomes brown and tough, forming a case shaped like a little barrel divided into rings. The transformation of the larva is quickly made and the animal is soon ready to emerge as a perfect insect."

How to Fry Potatoes.

Prof. Hot gives the following directions for frying potatoes: Cut them in whatever form you wish above a bowl of cold water, so that they will drop into it. Then drain and wipe them dry. This must be done quickly, so as not to allow the potatoes to turn reddish. Have a coarse towel ready, then turn the potatoes into a colander, and immediately turn them into the towel,
