Making Butter in Winter.

Now is the time when it becomes more and more important to be careful how they treat their cream and milk, and conduct their churning.

In winter the temperature must be kept up at the summer point, and not exceed it as is so often the case in raising it; raising it too high.

Now by this it will be seen how very careful the treatment is to be. Butter not changed, nor cream, either, in winter, unless you change it.

But a worse thing still, if possible, are the odors of the room. Here all the animal effluvia of the apartment are constantly being absorbed by the milk.

Clean vessels, clean milkers, uniform temperature (at 56 to 60 degrees) and pure air,—these are the requisites to making good butter, and they cannot be dispensed with.

If the food of your cow is also good, young, tender hay, with some bran, or other odorous food, and if you are careful in not breaking the grain of your butter when you work it, working out only the serum, why you have observed all that the most prudent adherer, and you will have their success.
