

Treatment of Distemper. The treatment of a common case of distemper is very simple, and requires internal medicines only...

If there is considerable swelling beneath the jaw or in the throat, the horse should be allowed to eat from the ground—consequently he should not be kept in the pasture—for that most likely will increase the swelling.

Internal medicines are required. A dose of tartar emetic, two scruples of sal ammoniac, two drachms with a little licorice root powder, anise seed powder and marshmallow root powder, either mixed with a little water and made into pills...

This is probably the largest creamery in New York State. At present, the milk of eight hundred and fifty cows is handled every day.

It is located in Franklin, Delaware Co., four miles from the line of the Albany and Susquehanna Railroad. The building is nicely finished, thirty-eight by sixty feet, with a wing twenty-eight by forty-four feet; two stories high, and in a part three stories high, with rooms for dwelling; water-tight rooms for rising cream, twenty-four by thirty eight feet; four six hundred gallon cheese vats, thirty presses, sixteen churns, carried by a six-horse power portable machine.

It was established in the spring of 1867, and is now operating on its fourth season. Butter and cheese is manufactured by the pound, at three cents for butter and two cents for cheese, and patrons pay all expenses for packages, salt, &c., for butter; boxes, bandages, annetto, &c., for cheese.

Says the N. Y. Tribune: "Our Tariff is eminently a Farmer's Tariff. At the recent joint meeting at Syracuse of the Wool growers and wool-manufacturers, a Massachusetts cloth-maker said that if the existing moderate duties were left undisturbed for the short space of six years, the cost of producing American cloths would be so reduced by the stimulus which Wool growing would receive, that they could not be under-sold by the pauper-woven cloths of Europe. Six years is a very short time to wait for equal Free Trade in Woolsens. Can't the British Importers be patient for that brief space? England has made the world wait over five hundred years for her profession of Free Trade, and conceded it at last only in the products in which she was an overmatch for the world. Be patient, foreigners. Just leave the American Tariff alone for ten years, and England and the rest of manufacturing Europe will get all the Free Trade out of us they want and a great deal more."

Dr. Hexamer, of N. Y., gives a result of an experiment of planting potatoes in seventeen different ways, and found the best results were given from one large potato, whole, in each hill; the next best from two large half potatoes cut lengthwise; next from medium sized whole potato; the smallest from small half potatoes. Each of the medium potato he plants whole; large ones cut in half and the largest in four pieces, each lengthwise, always taking care to select his best and soundest potatoes for seed.

J. T. Warner, of Ohio, in an experiment with Harrison, found that large seed cut in halves give the most reliable potatoes. He says: "This experiment, in connection with one made last year, induce me to cut good sized potatoes for seed in preference to planting them whole; and years of scarcity to use small potatoes with care not to plant them too closely together."

The powdered sulphur sold by druggists is a cheap preventive of parasites upon young chickens. After a hen has been setting till well established, sprinkle a small handful upon her eggs when she is off, and upon every part of the nest and for a little distance all around it. Then when she goes on disturb her just enough to make her bristle her feathers, and then just another handful down to the hen upon her head, neck and every part of the body not in contact with the nest, and do not omit to pinch under each wing. Then when the chickens are hatched there will be no vermin whatever to leave the hen and gather upon the young, as is frequently the case when no precautions are taken. One thorough application such as we have described will suffice.

To REMOVE STAINS OR RUST FROM IRONS.—Have a piece of yellow beeswax tied in a coarse cloth. When the iron is almost hot enough to use, but not quite, rub it quickly with the beeswax, and then with a clean coarse cloth. This will remove it entirely.
