Clover—How it Enriches the Land.

We are afraid of clover. We are afraid to raise it largely, and are afraid to feed it extensively, especially as a main feed; and afraid to plow it in. This is wrong, very wrong; we are constantly losing by not growing more clover; losing in many respects. Clover, if we could only impress the fact on the general farmer, is a plant that draws from the atmosphere and enriches the land. Other plants do this, but clover more; it has to do with the most vital and important element in manure, nitrogen, the very thing that is the rarest and most difficult to obtain. It improves the soil by its roots alone, if the crop is used for other purposes; this, even if a seed crop is taken. How much more benefit, then, if a whole crop is turned down containing so much nitrogen? And you have the manure without working for it. The plant works for itself and for you. We get its strength from a free source, the atmosphere, the great store-house that crops from all sources, but most from the negligent farmer. And you can make this plant work for you on a poor soil. A little manure applied on the surface will do this; and if plenty of seed is sown there will be a thick set. Then it needs but a chance with the atmosphere, and plaster will aid this greatly. With warm showers there will be a growth almost surprising. It will be dense, fine stemmed, of fair length, and furnish something on the season. Out of this what begins to lodge, which will be about the time when the blossoms appear, and then will be avoided all rot or mildew consequent on long, coarse lodging, and the yield will surprise you—two and a half and three tons, and such hay is not made from any other plant. And the second crop will be nearly or quite as good as the first.—Live Stock Journal.

Fresh Grapes at all Seasons.

Thd Stockton (Del.) Republican says: "We once knew a gentleman who supplied his table with fresh grapes from one season to another. His plan was to gather, when quite ripe, the largest and finest bunches of grapes, and pack them in sawdust, using in place of boxes, common nail-kogs, which he purchased for a trifle at hardware stores. After carefully packing the desired number of kegs, he buried a lot in a trench dug in high dry ground, beneath a shed where the water could neither fall nor soak in. Before using the sawdust, he carefully dried it either in the sun or in an oven, until it was entirely free from moisture. We never witnessed the packing process, but we know he always had the grapes, and in this way he told us he preserved them. After being buried for months, the grapes were as sweet and finely flavored as if just gathered from the vines. The process is cheap, and may be easily tested. If it will preserve the grape, a new and profitable business may be built up. Bunches of fresh ripe grapes in the spring would be a novelty, and would command a high price. We hope that some of our grape-growers will try the experiment."

Washes for Fruit Trees.

Twice a year, at least, every fruit tree in the orchard should be washed with some liquid, strong enough to destroy the eggs and pupae of insects, and the roots and spores of mosses and fungi. In using care to be for the death of insects, but in several persons have killed their trees, as sometimes the bark turns black and peels off after the application of this wash, and the death of the trees follows. Lime whitewash is recommended by some persons, but it is disproved of by the most experienced fruit growers; soapuds are harmless, but are too mild for the purpose for which they are used. The most suitable wash is a solution of sal-soda in the proportion of one pound of soda to a gallon of water. Rain water is the best for this purpose. This wash will not injure the bark, but will kill the eggs, or pupae of insects, and will clear away mosses, etc. It will remove dead bark, and produce a healthy surface.

Applying Manure.

A correspondent of the Rural Home writes: If the farmer has manure made, or kept through the summer, it will become fermented; it cannot be provided in the warm weather. Such manure is best applied on the surface, and worked in with the harrow; and if applied in winter when there is perhaps no better mode, as it has the mechanical effect of keeping the surface loose to resist the frosts of winter, as well as the stimulating effect of producing an early growth of the crop. But in the use of green manure in Spring and Summer crops experience has convinced me that to plow under and allow fermentation to take place in the soil, where all the volatile gases may be absorbed, and taken up by the growing crop, is most economical. We are often deceived in the effects of manure by the amount used. In applying common barn yard manure in an unfermented state, we get but about one third the amount of manure in the same bulk that we have when used in a decayed condition.

Fruit in Tin Cans.

The Boston Journal of Chemistry says: "The impression prevails among those who use freely fruits which are put up in tin cans, that they are injured thereby, and this impression is in many cases correct. We have long contended that all preserved fruits and vegetables should be stored in glass, and that no metal should be brought in contact with them. All fruits contain more or less of vegetable acids, and others that are highly corrosive, and the metallic vessels are considerably acted upon. The cans are held together by solder, an alloy into which lead enters largely. This metal is easily corroded by vegetable acids and poisonous salts are formed. Undoubtedly, many persons are greatly injured by eating tomatoes, peaches, etc., which have been placed in tin cans, and we advise our friends who contemplate putting up fruits for the present Summer to use only glass jars for the purpose."

Green Corn Dumpings.

A quart of green corn grated from the cob, half a pint of milk, half a pint of flour sifted, six tablespoonfuls of butter, two eggs, a teaspoonful of salt, a teaspoonful of pepper, and butter for frying. Having grated as fine as possible sufficient young fresh corn to make a quart, mix it with the wheat flour, and add the salt and pepper. Warm the milk in a small sauce pan, and soften the butter in it. Then add them gradually to the pan of corn, stirring very hard, and set it away to cool. Beat the eggs light and stir them into the mixture when it has cooled. Flour your hands, and make it into little dumplings. Put into the frying pan a sufficiency of fresh butter (or lard or butter in equal proportions), and when it is boiling hot, and has been skimmed, put in the dumplings and fry them ten minutes or more, in proportion to their thickness.
