Let it be remembered, that meat equally good and wholesome cannot be produced in any other way with so little expenditure of time and money, that we urge every farmer to adopt this suggestion. ## Fresh Blown Flowers in Winter.

The following directions are endorsed by the Manufacturer and Builder:
