Laws Relating to Newspaper Subscriptions and Arrearages.

The following is the law relating to newspa

Subscribers who do not give express notice to the con-trary, are considered wishing to continue their sul-

scription, 2. If subscribers order the discontinuance of their peri-olicals, the publishers may continue to send them until all arrearages are paid. 3. If subscribers neglect or refuse to take their periodicals from the office to which they are dire.ted, they are held responsible until they nave settled their bills, and order-el them discontinued.

them discontinued.

If subscribers move to other places without informing the publishers, and the papers are sent to the former di-rection, they are held responsible. The Courts have decided that "refusing to take periodi-cals from the office, or removing and nearing them un-called for, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud. Any person who receives a newspaper and makes use of it, whether he has ordered it or not, is held in law to be a subscriber.

If subscribers pay in advance, they are bound to give notice to the publisher, at the end of their time, if they do not wish to continue taking it; otherwise the pub-lishor is authorized to send it on, and the subscriber will be responsible until an expressnotice, with payment of all arroars, is sent to the publisher.
