is simply to wheel the manure into a heap in some central position, and every day, or as often, as the stables and yard are clear ed out, wheel the manure to the heap and spread it on top, instead of scattering it over a large surface. If the manure does not ferment, it is probably because it is too poor. The droppings from the hen-house, if scattered upon the heap and covered up, will help it. When you kill pigs, save the blood and pour it on the heap.— Any animal matter will be good. If the head is dry and cold, the hot water, hair, etc., you have left after scalding the pigs can be poured on the heap to advantage. In any case the horse stable is separated from the rest of the building. We throw the horse litter in to an empty stall, where it will keep dry. Every week or so we put this horse litter in a cart and draw it to the pigpens. Here it stays until it gets saturated with the rich liquor from the pigs, and is then wheeled to the heap.— There is no difficulty about getting such manure to ferment. It will be in prime condition for potatoes in the spring.

FEEDING FOR PROPIT.—The feeding of a pig through winter keeps him alive. There is no growth or very little. The feed is therefore, no better than wasted, and it cannot pay to feed a pig over winter to make an additional amount of pork. A March pig that will weigh 200 to 250 pounds at nine months old, is the most profitable one that can be fed. And a well bred pig can be made to weigh this by constant good feeding. One of our farmers says he has fed pigs to this weight and kept their mates over to the next year when the latter made 500 pounds of less. If nine months feed of a young pig makes 200 pounds of pork it cannot pay to feed a full grown pig, that needs twice the food, twelve months to make the same quantity.—Exchange.

MANURE FOR THE GARDEN.-J. M. Ryan, Knox county, asks for best fertilizers for vegetable garden. Well rotted stable manure; or better yet, compost, is perhaps the best, all things considered. Of commercial fertilizers, guano, bone dust, superphosphates, are all good. Ashes are excellent and so is lime. For kitchen garden, a compost heap, well handled, is indispensible. This should be commenced in the fall, and frequently turned, with additions of ashes, lime, poultry manure, muck, etc., whenever they can be collected. Apply at the rate of 50 to 200 tons per acre, according to soil.-Ohio Farmer.
