Weeds and Hay Fever.

It would seem that the general advantage of thorough cultivation ought to be sufficient inducement to incite the tiller of the soil to vigorous efforts for the suppression of weeds.

The hay season, however, is short, and ought to be much shorter, if farmers would have hay of the best quality, and is harmless as compared with the tediousness of the weed flowering season, during which the eyes are effected with itching inflammation, the bronchial and nasal parts violently excited, causing extreme and copious discharges of watery fluids from the nose.

These disagreeable effects, arising from negligent husbandry, are far more prevalent when the late summer and early autumn months are dry, as was the case during the past year.

A correspondent of the Live Stock Journal gives the following preventive of the ravages of these insects in cornfields. Soak the seed in copperas water twenty-four hours before planting.

Soak your seed one night in a tub of equal proportions of lye made from ashes and common urine, with a fair portion of blue stone dissolved therein.

The bean crop is worthy a place in a rotation, not only for its profit, but for its influence upon the soil. It takes little from the soil; is a cleaning crop; requires little outlay for seed, occupies the ground but a short time, and may follow a crop of clover the same season, if an early ripening variety is chosen.

How Salt Fish Should be Freshened.—Many persons are in the habit of freshening mackerel and other salt fish, and never dream that there is a right and a wrong way to do it.
