

when the seed is to be formed that the plant needs to store up this material. If superphosphates are applied in the fall upon the soil containing lime, the excess of soluble phosphoric acid combines with the lime and makes an insoluble (or slowly soluble) phosphate which has no appreciable effect upon the crop. It is for this reason, and not for any fault or defect of the fertilizer, that it so often seems to be useless. Guano, on the contrary, immediately active, and much more suitable for fall use than any other artificial manure. Superphosphate of lime should be applied in the spring, which is the season when it will be most useful to the plant.

Fattening Horses.

For fattening a horse there is probably no grain superior to barley. In Germany barley is ground into flour and made into cakes for horses, and in England it is generally boiled and fed at evening. Five pounds at a feeding three times a day is the rate of feeding barley at the West, and it is regarded as a very fattening food. Green rye or clover may be cut green B and fed to the horse in the stall to better advantage than turning out to pasture. But probably a liberal supply of Sweedish turnips or rutabagas cut in slices and liberal- B ly covered with Indian meal, will lay on fat as fast as is desirable. It is, we think, about the best substitute for green food, gives a soft and glossy coat, an elastic step and good spirits. We do not think the yellow or Sweedish turnip is appreciated as it ought to be, as a food for horses.-Massachusetts Plowman.

Plank Floors Ruinous to Horses.

Can't some genius invent some kind of stable floor that can be kept clean without too much labor, and not ruin the feet of horses standing on it? A horse which we kept in the stable last winter came out in the spring so lame that he could not strike a trot, and his limbs seemed weak and tender, although we could find no sore or tender spot, nor were his limbs swollen.

We enclosed a small plot of grass, and turned him out, cutting grass for him. In one week from the time we turned him out, he could trot off quite lively, and now he has nearly recovered. He seemed to be lame in every foot, and especially in his hind feet, and we have no doubt that standing idle upon a plank floor caused his hoofs to become dry, hard, and contracted so that they pressed upon the tender frog. -Rural Home.

Thistle Tea for Nerualgia.

A gentleman of Norfolk, Virginia, who has been tortured for some time with neuralgia, hearing of a noted physician in Germany who invariably cured that disease, visited him for treatment. He was permanently cured after a short sojourn, and the doetor freely gave him the simple remedy used, which was nothing but a poultice of tea made from our common field thistle. The leaves are macerated and used on the parts affected, as a poultice, while a small quantity of the leaves are boiled down, in the proportien of a quart to a pint, and a small wine glass of the decoction drank bofore each meal.
