A general complaint among the millers is, the neglect of our farmers to more closely inspect their seed, and prevent adulteration of their wheat with rye, cockle and other seeds, which tend to lower our standard grades of flour. We think this is not sufficiently impressed upon the minds of our millers and farmers, and would recommend that hereafter we strive to procure for farmers, in our immediate vicinities, suitable grain for seed, and reward those who take the trouble to procure such seed, and furnish an extra article of grain, by premiums, either as individual millers, or by an association.
