

What Constitutes a Good Fertilizer.

No ordinary plant can thrive without a sufficient supply of each of a number of substances needed for its food.

Every ordinary soil contains all the ingredients of plant food. In "worn out" soils the available supply of one or more of these is generally insufficient.

Fertilizers supply the plant with food which the soil lacks. Barnyard manure not only does this, but also improves the soil as a living place for plants.

To Make a Manure Spreader.

Procure a strong pole, about ten feet long and six inches in diameter, and secure a tongue in the middle, so as to form a large T. The tongue may be bolted or secured by mortise and tenon.

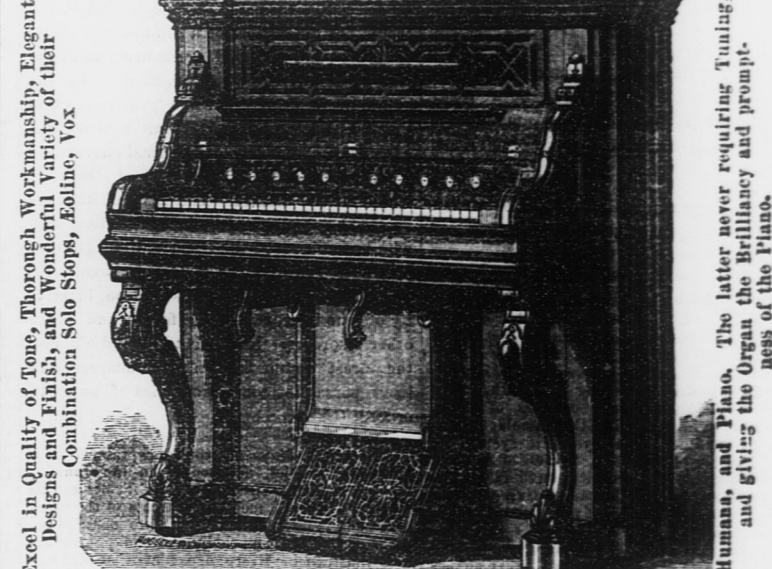
