> Housekeepers and others are much troubled to keep their dried fruit from worms. A contemporary says that a handful of sassafras bark sprinkled through a bushel of fruit is a preventive from this pest.

CRULLERS-Two coffee cups of ugar, one coffee cup of milk, four eggs, six tablespoonfuls of lard, two teaspoonfuls of cream of tartar, one teaspooful of soda, flour to make stiff enough to roll; fry in boiling lard; spice to suit the taste.

One gallon of strained tomato juice, two pounds of sugar, seven teapoonfuls of salt, four tablespoonfuls of black pepper, half a tablespoonful of allspice, three tablespoonfuls of mustard, half a pod of red pepper, a little horse-radish. Boil well, and just before taking off the fire add one quart of good vinegar.

TOMATO AND BEEF STEW-Slice three pounds of lean beefand seven moderate-sized tomatoes with one onion. Cut the tomatoes up into fine. Stew slowly; add salt, a tew cloves, and, just before it is done, a little butter and half a gill of catsup. The remains of this dish may be kept and heated over the next day, if desired.

PLAIN PUDDING—Lay dry bread in the oven till it is brown, then roll fine, and put a layer in the bottom of a buttered dish; then put on a layer of chopped sour apples; over this sprinkle sugar, a few bits of butter and a little ground cinnamon; another layer of the crumbs, and so on till the dish is full, having bread for the last layer with butter in little bits over it. Pour boiling water on enough to moisten, and bake till the apples are done. The top should be a nice brown; serve with sugar and butter-two teaspoons of butter and six of sugar, stirred to a cream.
