then? A gloomy world for him.

Every one must have noticed how natural it is for cattle to lick themselves, and even to lick each other. In this way the hair is freed from dust, and irritation of the skin is allayed. And how much gratification is evinced by the animal while this process is going on. The amount of cleaning thus received, at many intervals during the day, is very considerable, and may determine the difference between thriving and not thriving. But how can a cow indulge the natural propensity to lick and clean herself if her head is constantly confined in a staunchion? With. out this indulgence, or some substitute for it, can she reasonably be expected to do as well? We think not. Some writer has said that "cattle during the Winter, while kept in the barn most of the time, should receive a thorough brushing daily. Cattle that have their heads tied get very dirty about the head and neck, unless they receive careful grooming. Cleanliness is very essential to their health." True, every word of it. The currycomb and brush are the proper substitutes for the natural cleaning process of the animal.

No one doubts the benefit and even necessity of using comb and brush freely on the horse. Their use is better than extra it, can she reasonably be expected to do as the horse. Their use is better than extra feed. Why doubt its efficacy on the cow? These who have tried it, know how bene-These who have tried it, know how beneficial it is. If we deprive the animal of its freedom and impose artificial conditions we must supply the demands of nature artificially. Can any proposition be more reasonable ? - American Dairyman.

About Sick Animals.

Nearly all sick animals become so by improper feeding in the first place. Nine cases out of ten the digestion is wrong. Charcoal is the most efficient and rapid corrective. It will cure in a majority of cases, if properly administered. An example of its use: The hired man came in with the intelligence that one of the finest cows was very sick, and a kind neighbor proposed the usual drugs and potions. The owner being ill and unable to examine the cow, concluded that the trouble came from overheating, and ordered a teacupful of pulverized charcoal given in water. It was mixed, placed in a junk bottle, the head held upward, and the water and charcoal poured downward. In five minutes improvement was visible, and in a few hours the animal was in the pasture quietly eating grass. Another instance of equal success occurred with a young heifer which had become badly bloated by eating green apples after a hard wind. The bloat was so severe that the sides were hours the animal was in the pasture quietbloat was so severe that the sides were almost as hard as a barrel. The old remedy, saleratus, was tried for correcting the acidity. But the attempt to put it down always caused coughing, and it did little almost as hard as a barrel. The old remgood. Half a teaspoonful of fresh powdered charcoal was given. In six hours all appearance of bloat had gone, and the heifer was well .- Live Stock Journal.

MUTTON CHOPS GRILLED :- Melt a little better in a pan with some seasoning. Ocver the mutton chops with the melted butter, and then sprinkle bread-crumbs over them as quickly as possible. The chops are now to be cooked over a good fire, in ho. butter, care being taken that the bread crumbs do not burn, and that the meat be thoroughly cooked. Serve with sprigs of parsley and sliced lemon.

To PRESERVE MEAT IN WARM WEATH-ER. Veal, mutton, pork, &c., will keep perfectly fresh and good for weeks, without walt or ice, in warm weather, by keeping it submerged in sour milk, changing milk when mould appears. Rinse in cold water when wanted for use. Animal heat must be kept out. Keeps any length of time, and retains flavor.


