The Journal thinks it is probable that the wheat crop of this year will be the largest ever produced in this country. The average yield of the best years is about 360,000,000 bushels. This year, with the general freedom from grasshoppers and the largely increased acreage in the finest wheat-growing portions of the continent-notably Northern Minnesota and Dakato-it can hardly fail to go considera bly above that figure—perhaps 375,000,000 bushels. Of this product, at least twofifths, 150,000,000, will probably go abroad.
