Coloring Recipes. Brown on Cotton or Woolen.—For ten pounds of cloth or yarn, take two pounds of cutch, put into cold water sufficient to cover the goods, heat until dissolved;

Yellow on Cotton.—Dissolve one-half pound of sugar of lead in hot water, and one-fourth pound bicarbonate of potash in cold water—both in wooden vessels.

Blue on Cotton.—Take two ounces oxalic acid, two ounces Prussian blue and dissolve in separate pails of hot water.
