

**A Lady Shooter.**  
A very startling scene took place in a ball room at Gray's Tavern, Fox Cove, Oldtown, Me., a few days since. One William Bowman, an Upper Stillwater convict, was very pleasantly dancing, when a young woman rose from her seat, without a promissory word, discharged a double barreled pistol at him. One barrel took effect in the back portion of his right shoulder, which rendered him the most intense sufferer. The affair created the most intense excitement. The woman justifies her conduct by charging him with seduction, and under promise of marriage, which she refused to make good, that a critical era is approaching. She vehemently regrets that the ball did not pierce his heart, instead of so by a substance as his shoulder. So strongly is public sympathy on the injured woman's side, that no attempt has been made to arrest her—nor is it supposed there will be.

**Arrest and Discharge of the Shooting Lady.**  
The young girl, who shot Bowman in the crazy dance at Fox Cove, was yesterday arrested on his complaint and carried before Justice Aldford, at Oldtown. At the hour appointed for the investigation, the complainant and the accused confronted each other, but no witness appeared. The justice thereupon discharged her. She said she intended to shoot someone; had found by her demonstration that the person was on her side, and she thought she should let him run—said she derived pleasure from the treatment of her. She is but sixteen years of age, and has an eye denoting great firmness of purpose. It is said that Bowman at the time he was shot had a pistol upon his person, which it is supposed he intended to defend himself with, but having threatened him. The wound received will lame him for life, it is thought. Some say she says that her discharge will prove a dangerous precedent, which, if acted upon, Oldtown and Upper Stillwater may become depopulated.—*Bangor Mercury, March 4.*
