MARKETS
FLOUR AND MEAL.—Flour is firm and prices are higher. Sales of 500 lbs. shipping brands at \$9 1/2 for common and good brands, and \$10 50 to 11 50 for extra and family. Little do in Rye Flour: sales are steady at \$2 75. Penna. Corn Meal is held at \$4 37 1/2 per bu. There is a limited amount of wheat offering and prices are higher. Limited sales of prime Southern and Penna. rye at \$2 12 a 2 14 per bu., and poor white at \$2 13 and 2 14 per bu. White at \$2 30 per bu. Rye is held at \$1 25 per bu., with fine grades. Corn is higher. Sales of 3000 lbs. of old yellow at 90c. Oats are in good demand—sales of 1600 lbs. at 41 a 42c. per bu. Whiskey is in fair demand at 41 a 41 1/2 cts. in bls., and 40 a 41c. in hds.
