Altered bids should be submitted; nor should bids on submitted be withdrawn. No withdrawal of a bidder or guarantor, will be allowed unless notice is given to the department...

Each bid must be guaranteed by two responsible persons. The department reserves the right to reject any bid which may be deemed extravagant, and also to disregard the bids of failing contractors and bidders...

The bid should be sealed, superscribed "Mail Proposals, State of Maryland," addressed "Second Assistant Postmaster General, Contract Office," and sent by mail, not by an agent; and postmaster will not enclose proposals (or letters of any kind) in their quarterly returns.

Section eighteen of an act of Congress approved March 3, 1846, provides that contractors for the transportation of the mail shall be let "in every case to the lowest bidder tendering sufficient guaranty for faithful performance, without other mode of such transportation than may be necessary to provide for the due execution of the contract."

Under this law, bids that propose to transport the mail with "celerity, certainty, and security," have been decided to be the only valid bids, and their legal liabilities will be enforced against them.

2. Postmaster at offices on or near railroads, but more than eighty rods from a station, will immediately after the 31st of March next, report their exact distance from the nearest station, and how they are otherwise supplied with the mail, to enable the Postmaster General to direct a mail-messenger supply from the office of July next.
