

**Agricultural.**

**Excited Soil.**—Some say our apple trees are overworked, because they are planted upon old, poor, and worn-out, or exhausted soil. This seems to be true to some extent, and the remedy is to manure your orchards every other year with barnyard manure, lime, salt, bone-meal, or any other manure, as experience has shown to be essential for a vigorous and healthy growth, and a productive fruiting of the apple tree. Our old orchards, planted of many years ago, used no such manure, because they were planted on new grounds, and were very rich in all the elements that were necessary for the production of large crops of apples.
