We, the undersigned Auditors of Luneaster County of certify, that we have carefully examined the foregoing account of Benjamin Reinhold, Evg., Treasurer of said county, and have compared his vouchers with the same, and find there is a balance in his hands, of Eleven Thousand Five handred and Thirty-four dol lars and ninety-nine cents, (\$11.534 99.) for which amount he have shown us the recept of Charles M Howell, E-q., the present Treasurer.

In the foregoing outstanding taxes due by several townships, it shows great negligence on the part of collectors, either in collecting or paying over the same to the Treasurer, which is a loss to the county, as the Gommissioners have to resort to loans, on that account.
