The under-signed, members of the committee, do respectfully report, that we saw the two Safes originally agreed upon by Turrel & Herring, and Evans & Waison, placed side by side in a farnnee, viz: The Safe in use by the Paymaster of the Philadelphia and Reading Railrond Company, in his office at Reading, manufactured by Farrels & Herring, and the Safe in use by H. A. Laniz, in his store, manufactured by Farsels & Herring, and the Safe in use by H. A. Laniz, in his store, manufactured by Evans & Waison, and put in books precisely nlike. the Safe in ose by H. The fire was started at \$\frac{3}{2}\text{ o'clock A.
