# BATTLE NEAR SANTA FE.

-DENVER, April 7 \_\_ Information from New Mexico states that on the 20th ult, Colonel Hough, with thirteen hundred men, reached Apache Bay, his advance consisting of three companies of cavalry. He had an engage ment beyond this place, with two hundred and fity Rebel caralry and took fifty-seven prisoners. The Federal loss was four killed and eleven wounded.

At Pigeou Ranche, fifteen miles from Santa Fe, on the 19th ult., Col. Hough met eleven hundred Texans strongly posted in the mouth of a capon. Col. Hough engaging the enemy in front with seven companies, while Major Cherington with four companies attacked their rear, succeeded in driving the Rebel guard away from their supply train, which was captured and burned. We also capjured one cannon after spiking it. The fight continued from noon till four o'clock, when it ceased by mutual consent. Col. Hough withdrew his forces to a creek four miles distant. The Federal Joss was four officers and twenty privates killed, and from forty to fifty wounded .-The Rehel loss is not known.

Communication between Cols. Hough and Canby is continually kept up.

### Confirmation of the Battle at Apache Pass.

KANSAS CITY, April 14. Hap. E. M. Stanton, Secretary of War:

The mail from Fort Union brings confirmation of the battle of Apache Pass. Our loss is 150 killed, wounded and missing.-The enemy acknowledge their loss to be from three to four hundred killed and wounded. Hinety-three Rebels were taken prisoners, thirtgen of whom were officers.-Our forces captured and burned sixty-four wagons laden with provisions and ammuni-

tion, killing 200 mules, The Texans attacked our bettery four times, the last time coming within forty feet TEE Ladics' of the Lutheran Church will of our guns, but were repulsed with heavy loss. Colonel Slough is encamped at Bernal Springs, forty miles from Fort Union. The Texan's fell back to Santa Fe. Colonel Canby, with 1,000 regulars and Kit Carson's regiment, are reported within three days' march of Colonel Slough; and Colonel Slate is on the Jornida with reinforcements for the enemy.

The Reported Capture of Fort Craig by the Rebels Untrue.

WASHINGTON, April 16 .--- The report copied from Southern papers, that Colonel .Canby had surrendered Fort Craig and his entire force is untrue. Later advices from that vicinity have been received at the War Bepartment that Col. Canby has obtained a success over the enemy, and has been reinforced, and is now in pursuit of the enemy.

The following despetch reached the Navy Department on Tuesday night:

CAIRO, ILLINOIS, April 15 .- The figtilla has been within three quarters of a mile of Fort Pillow, and then, returning, took up a position two miles further up. The Rebel gunboats escaped below the fort. Ten mortar boats were in position, and had opened fire. This is up to six o'clock last evening. .Gen. Pope's command occupied the Arkansas side of the river.

PULASKI. .TERRIBLE EFFECT OF OUR BOMBARD. MENT. SURRENDER OF FORT PULASEI. FORTRESS MONBOE, April 14 .- A flag of truce went up to Craney Island this afternoon and brought back two Norfolk papers. They were taken to headquarters, and though containing the information of the unconditional surrender of Fort Pulaski, an verv elegant effort has been made in accordance with the policy that prevails here, to keep even this good news from the representatives of the press, I am, however, able to give you the substance of the glorious news as published in the Savannah Republican. The Republican says substantially "that it learns with deep regret that, after a gallant defence against guns mostly superior. Fort Pulaski surrendered at two o'clock P. M. yesterday (the 11th). Corporal Law, of the Pulaski Guards, who did not leave Thunderbolt until after the flag was hauled down, brings intelligence of the sorrowful event. The surrender was unconditional. Seven large breaches were made in the south wall by the federal battery of eight Parrott guns at King's Landing. All the barbatte guns on that side were dismounted, and also three of the casemate guns, leaving but one gun bearing on that point. Three balls entered the magazine, and a clear breach was made in it. The balls used were conical, propelled with such force that they went clear through the walls at nearly every fire. Colonel Qlassend, who was in command, telegraphed the previous evening that no human being could stand upon the ramparts for even a single moment, and that over one thousand large shells had exploded within the fort." Republican publishes this as a postscript to a part of its edition, and makes no comments, nor gives any particulars as to 'dis distorter of men and officers in the fort at the time of its surrender. It says, how-ever, that none of its defenders were killed and but four wounded.


