### Experiences of Prisoners Taken at Fredericksburg.

One of the eighty officers taken on the Rappahannock, and just released on parole till exchanged, furnishes the following details of their experience! When they had marched about five miles on the road to Gordonsville, a courier met them, who informed their guard that Stoneman was in that vicinity, whereupon they were marched

They then took a fresh start toward Richmond, but were again stopped by another courier with the same intelligence. Con-Siderable anxiety and apprehension were 'evinced as to Stoneman's exact whereabouts. The third time they proceeded by a circuitous route, arriving at Spottsylvania Court House on Sunday night.

Col. Miller, robel commander at this place, tried to procure food for them, but failed, there being none obtainable for his own men, who said they had nothing to eat since the preceding Saturday at noon.

The next morning they were marched fifteen miles to Guineas Station, where they were put into an open field in a hard rain. and kept there all night.

On Tuesday, a barrel of flour was issued to them, to be baked and divided as best they could among the whole number, which was the first morsel of any kind they had partaken of since their capture --- nearly

partaken of since their capture—nearly three days.

The next night they were put in a rail-road car and taken to Richmond, receiving jeers and insults in profusion at the several stations, the women being particular abusivo. Arriving at Richmond, they were put in a prison guarded by citizens with old tauskets, some of which were not loaded.
