FROM A LATE LETTER.—We extract the following from a late letter received from an officer in the 43d Reg., dated, before Petersburg, July 3d: 'We are within sixty yards of the Rebels. Sharp shooting on both sides. We, (our Regt.) are opposite the 2d South Carolina, the boys are hollering at one another while I write. The 43d has lost since the campaign, 74 killed, 388 wounded and 31 taken prisoner. Total 493, among the killed 5 officers and 13 wounded.'

TOWN MEETING.—On Wednesday evening last, pursuant to public notice, a meeting convened in Odd Fellows' Hall, for the purpose of recruiting men to serve for one hundred days. R. Williams was chosen president, who stated the object of the meeting. Col. J. W. Case made a few remarks in which he stated that he would give one thousand dollars to the first company of one hundred men to be raised in Columbia. This noble and patriotic offer should not go unheeded. If other business men felt the same interest in the cause and welfare of the nation as does Mr. Case, we would have no trouble of raising troops in Columbia. We hope our town will keep up her former reputation in raising troops, and form at least one company to be attached to the gallant Col. Fisher's Lancaster county regiment. Very few, as yet, have responded. Capt. Goodman, late of the Reserves, will take charge of recruiting in Columbia. His office is in Odd Fellows' Hall, where information will be given relative to the service, &c.
