## The Pork Disease.

A Western letter writer says the pork disease has appeared in Marion, Linn county, Iowa. A whole family, consisting of eight or ten persons, was taken sick, and after an investigation it was found that they had been eating dried beef and smoked ham, in its raw state, as dried beef is eaten. The physicians who were called in at once, decided that their illness was dug to trichinosis. One member of the family died on Friday and one on Saturday, and at the time of writing three more were in a dangerous state. while three others were apparently convalescing. Before death, the victims became bloated in the limbs, face and neck. They would throw up bloody mucus, and they died delirious. We see no evidence in these symptoms, however, that the parties died of trichinosis, the physicians to the contrary notwitlistanding. The effect of trichinosis would probably be very slow. It seems more like poisoning from raw and unwholesome meat.
