Neither, however intense his pain, emits arry or a groan. So, at the polls, the conflicting parties worked with silent but determined resolution. As to business, none was done. Everybody seemed given over to labor at the polls. All the might and power of the Administration was brought to bear npon the election of the Democratic ticket, but all to no purpose. The returns received from the State show large gains for the Republican party. Gen. Geary has been elected Governor by a majority which will probably reach eighteen thousand.

Caleb N. Taylor has been elected to Congress from the fifth District by 500 majority. Covode, in the Twenty-first District, is reported to be elected by 350 majority. And General Cake the Re-

10,000 to 15,000 majority. The Republicans claim eight Congressmen and a majority in both branches of the Legislature.

Iowa has also gone Republican by a large majority.

In Baltimore, Chayman, Republican, and the entire City Council ticket are elected. Chapman's majority for Mayor is 2840. The vote is very light, the election being controlled by the original registration list.
