The Elections in the South. The late elections in the Southern States show conclusively that the white Democrats, or the late master-class of the South, have altogether failed to do what they have so often declared they had the power to do—control the political action of their late slaves. They seem in fact to have exercised no influence whatever over those who recently cowered before their every look. In some places, where one or two negroes have voted with the whites, the latter have got up immense jubilations over their colored confreres, and have toasted them in corn whisky or apple jack till all bands were so drunk it. no one knew what was the matter. We notice that in one Virginia county, where a black man voted the Conservative ticket, a subscription has been started to present him with a house and a lot of land, and we have no doubt they will add a swallow-tail and a shiny hat, if he desires them. All this, it must be confessed, is rather estonishing, in view of what has been reiterated often about the Southern whites controlling the blacks. It shows how little, after all, the Southerners knew about the people whom they nursed and played with, whom they cuffed and kicked. whom they bought and sold, whom they watched over and protected, whom they loved so warmly and worked so much more warmly, and whom at last they emancipated from throldom, with the consent of Abraham Lincoln. It really seems as if the Southorners knew less about their own slaves than people who never in their lives saw a black man.

A curious painting was taken among others from the old Bull Inn, London, early in the present century. It is a portrait by Haymore of one Van Horn, a Hambro merchant, of whom posterity should know more. This Van Horn be-longed to a club called the "Amicable Society," held at the above named Inn for twenty-two years; and in that period he drank 35,687 bottles of wine, which was four and hulf bottles a day. During that time he missed but two days, one when he buried his wife, and one when his daughter was married.
