days ago: "Take the candidates, for instance, who represent the conflicting ideas of public duty in this election. I have seen General Grant stigmatized as a bad General, an incompetent man, and a confirmed drunkard. I have not the honor of his acquaintance, but when I am told he is no soldier, I can only say, "Donnelson;" when you say he is a dolt, my heart responds, "Vicksburg;" and when I hear of his intemperance, I can only quote Mr. Lincoln, and wish we had more generals in the war who knew his ipple. No, gentlemen, he finished the war, and that is enough to entitle him to my respect and admiration."

With economy come frugality and temperance, and so upon the farm grow the hardy virtues like tough trees upon the rough mountain side, and so the ideal farmer is the strong, robust, simple, sensible, truly conservative citizen, and as the spectator sees him stand crowned with content in the midst of his rural realm, he asks as the poor clergyman asks bis richer brother as they walked through the rich minister's mag-"What, Brother Dives, all this, and Heaven too?"

Minnesota's Wealth. are represented as being in a most prosperous condition. Up to the year 1857, nearly all the breadstuffs consumed in that State were grown without its limits. In 1857, the number of plowed acres did not

exceed twelve thousand. In 1860 there were four hundred and thirty thousand acres under cultivation; in 1866, one million, and in 1867 one million two hundred thousand. Minnesota now ranks as one of the first wheat-growing States in the Union. The exports of wheat in 1865 were eight million bushels; in 1866, over ten million; and in 1867, more than twelve million.
