In accordance with the acts of Con gress, passed July 25th, 1868, Gen Howard has issued an order for the discontinuing on December 21st, of the operations of the Freedmen's Bureau, except the Educational Department, and in the collection and payment of money due soldiers and sailors, and their fees from the Goverument on account of military services. All officers, except such as are needed as above stated, will be discharged, and all the unneeded property of the Bureau

The Educational Department is placed under an Assistant Commissioner in each of the Southern States, and one Assistant Superintendent of Schools in the District of Columbia, with a suficient number of subordinates. The freedmen's hospitals are to be closed up by the first of January, 1869 .- Thus-will pass into history the Bureau of Refugees, Freemen and Abandoned Lands, as an agency in securing to the country in fact a portion of what it won in the theory of the war. Few, except Democrats, will mourn the loss: To them it has furnished considerable party capital, which they will part from with reluctance.

Decision of Chief Justice Chase. A few days ago. Chief Justice Chase presiding in the United States Court at Richmond, decided an important case. His opinion establishes, so far as the judgment of that court can establish it, the right of stockholders in loyal States to the dividends declared during the war upon the stock held by them in Southern railroads, notwithstanding the confiscation of such stock and dividends by the late Confederate government. It explains what is meant by the term de facto government, and it promulgates the rule that Confederate notes received in the rebel States on account of parties in loyal States innocent of acts violating the interdicts against commercial intercourse, must be accounted for in lawful money equal in value to the Confederate notes at time of receipt. The Cuban Revolution.

The Cuban revolution seems to be gaining ground. In a recent engagement the forces of the Imperial Count Balmaseda have been defeated, according to the accounts of the revolutionists, and as the Imperialists do not claim a victory in the battle, it is likely that the fortunes of the latter are somewhat on the wane. In another engagement the government forces claim the advantage, giving the highlycolored news of eighty-three rebels killed, and but one Imperialist! As we receive nearly all the news through the organs of the latter party, we should be careful how we form our opinions of the contest. At any rate, it is not the mere outbreak the present Cuban Government would have us believe.
