General Logan on the Decoration of Rebel Graves.

General Logan has issued an order, dated at Washington, June 2, as Commanderin-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, in which he explains officially why the graves of Rebels were not decorated as well as those of Union soldiers. He says that the charges against the marines on gaurd at Arlington are wilful exaggerations. The gaurdreceived their instructions from the committee, and it is believed that they, discharged their duty in a proper manner and spirit. The Grand Army of the Republic seeks to honor and preserve the principles and institutions for which its members and their dead

comrades fought. We strew flowers, therefore, on the graves of our comrades, and prevent their being strewn in the national cemeteries at the same time on the graves of such Rebel dead as may be buried therein, not because we cherish any feelings of hate or desire to triumph over individual focs, but because we seek to mark in this distinction and manner the feeling with which the nation regards freedom and slavery, loyalty and treason, republican principles and those of slaveholding oligarch. We are ready to forgive-we hold no malice-but we will never consent by public national tribute to obliterate the wide gulf which lies between the objects, motives, and principles for which we fought and our comrades died, and those for which the Rebel armies banded together, and for which their dead now lie in numerous graves.

The Conscience Fund. A pleasant piece of news is it that comes from Washington to the effect that the contributions of the "Conscience Fund' are rapidly increasing. In 1861 only two hundred and fifty dollars were paid in while during five months of this year over fifteen thousand dollars have been received. This would seem to indicate that, in spite of assertions to the contrary, the moral sense of the nation is steadily growing stronger and clearer. The Conscience Fund may very appropriately be considered a moral thermometer, and its constant rising ought to cause us heartfelt satisfac-

Astronomy in Public Schools. Microscopes, of a high power, have been purchased in many of the public schools of New York city, by means of weekly penny contributions for "peeps" made by the scholars. The pupils and teachers, it is stated, exhibited a growing tast for the study of natural and scientific subjects. One of the superintendents of the public schools has been engaged in promoting these studies, and during the last seven months has distributed ninety-five lenses and twelve compound lenses, which were paid for in the way mentioned. The Microscopical Society of New York, on being informed of these facts, promised to furnish to the schools a handsome number of mounted "objects" from the duplicates. "objects" from the duplicates.

The discoveries of science explain to us what this "fervent heat" is. It is heat sufficiently intense to raise molten clouds from the vapor of burning metals. And at the same time it tells us where inconceivable quantities of these boiling metals are even now kept in store, ready at the command of the Creator to set on fire the very heavens, and to fall in showers and consume the earth and all the parts thereof.

Education in Europe. A map giving the rank of different countries of Europe, based upon the relative efficiency and extent of the education imparted in their primary schools, has recently been published. The several nations rank follows: Saxony, Switzerland, small States of North Germany, Denmark, Prussia, Sweden, Baden, Wurtemberg, Holland, Norway, Bavaria, France, Belgium, England, Italy, Austria, Greece, Papal States, Spain, Portugal, Waldo-Walacia, Russia, Turkey.

A Villain Captured. Detective Wety, of the Fort Wayne Railroad, has been engaged during the last week in hunting up a seducer in Pennsylvania. He captured him in Green county, Pennsylvania, after traveling nearly 1800 miles. He was taken to Salem, Ohio, and placed under bonds of one thousand dollars, to awnser a charge of seduction. The girl is but about sixteen years old.

Beer. Beer is a pretty big thing, even in this " blarsted country," according to the figures presented at the Brewers' Congress. Nearly six million barrels of it were sold in 1868. The capital used to produce this quantity is valued at one hundred and five million dollars, and the number of persons employed is stated at forty-one thousand.
