The Monthly Agricultural Report.
The monthly report of the Department of Agriculture for July has just been printed at the government printing office. The present number embraces a condensed statement of the condition of the growing crops, together with a variety of extracts from the correspondence of the department, and minor items from various sources, compiled by J. R. Dodge, Esq., the statistician of the department. Notwithstanding the heavy rains and low temperature, the reports concerning the wheat crop are generally favorable, Kentucky, West Virginia and Virginia producing the best average crop, while in Wisconsin and several Northwestern States, the crop is considerably below the average. The prospect for the corn crop on the first of July was fully up to the general average. This can be said of the rye crop. In this crop Delaware and Nebraska stand foremost. The oat crop is reported especially in Florida, Texas, Kansas and Nebraska, which produced twenty per cent above the average yield, while in all except Kentucky the crop is reported as an average one. The other crops all look favorable, especially potatoes, which promise an abundant yield. The fruit crop is a little below the average in New England and New York and the Southern States, and above the average in the Middle and most of the Western States.
