Grooming Horses. Though suitable and properly prepared food is the prime requisite for the horses, regular grooming holds the second place in the management of him. A man who omits the customry ablutions at stated times-who goes for days or for weeks with uncombed hair, may exist-but does not live in the proper sense of the word. So of the horse. Grooming as alike essential to looks, health, and elasticity of action. The curry-comb and card should be brought daily requistion, nor should the clip. ping shears be omitted. Fetlocks bedraggled with mud, unkempt and tangled nane, detract much from the appearance of the animal, repress his ambition, and hence diminish his usefulness. A man who neglects the regular grooming of his horses is an enemy both to the beast and himself; to them because he witholds labor which is their due, and to himself because he depreciates the value of his

To Dive Away Roaches and Ants. Take powdered borax and scatter where ever the cockrocalics must frequent, and they will disappear directly. A safe and efficacious remedy for a most annoying vermin. Ants can be driven out of cupboards if lumps of camphor are scattered about them. Ants object to strong scents, and in tropical climates are prevented from entering rooms by powerfully scented oils and gums. A sponge can be spainkled with sugar and lay upon shelves where auts are numerous; next morning plunge the sponge quickly into boiling water, and most of the intruders will be destroyed; then scatter camphor and you will have no trouble.

Fever in Animals.

When your animal has a fever all stimulating articles are to be avoided .- Bleed ing to reduce the circulation; purging for removing irritactng substance from the bowels; cooling drinks to allay thirst and supply decreas specretions; rest and quiet to tone down the system, are what common sense would seem to dictate, and what nature would seem require. This is safer than to crain the animal with a multiplicity of cures, without regard to anything except the fact that something is the matter. We trust farmers and owners of animals will heed the admonition

Boiling potatoes.

There is a great deal constantly said as to the best way to boil potatees. The following, said to be an Irish mode, is no doubt, very good .- It is said that in Ireland they always nick off a piece of the skin, put them in a pot cold water, which is gradually heated but never allowed to boil; cold water should be added as soon as the water begins to boil; when done, pour all the water off, cover the vessel with a cloth, and in a few minutes they are cool enough for use.

APPLE JELLY-Fall pippen apple are decidedly the best for jelly. To one peck apples pared andquartered, take three pints of water and the juice of one lemon, with a vory little lemon peel; stew until soft, then pour into a jelly bag let drain ; to every pint of juice add a pound of sugar; set it on the fire; take off any scum that arises; let boil twenty or thirty minutes, occasionally with a spoon to see if it jellies. If ready to pour in glasses the syrup will drop thick:

APPLE TARTS .- Stew eight tart apples as for sauce, sweeten and add cinnamou and a tablespoonful of butter while ho; when cold add half a teacup of read crumbs, and yolks of four eggs well beaten, with a cup of sweet milk, bake with under crust, when done beat the white of the egg and four large spoonsful of white sugar and extract to suit taste, beat stiff. oour over the tarts, set them in the oven o gain a light brown.

BAKED TOMATOES .- Turn boiling waer ovor them; cover them up, and let them stand one hour; then peel them and lay as many as will cover the bottom of a pie dish; season them with pepper and salt, and sprinkle fine bread crumbs over them, with some pieces of butter; then put another layer of tomatoes, another seasoning, bread crumbs and butter; until the dish is filled. Bake it an hour.

Japanese Cakes.

(One of the nicest of breakfast cake) One pint of milk; one and a half pints of flour, one egg; half teaspoonful of salt. Stir the milk by degrees into the flour; then add the beaten egg, and beat all together for a few minutes. Bake in 12 earthen teacups, or in a French roll

PEACH MARMADADE. Taker four lbs. ight brown sugar, and twelve lbs. peaches broken in halves, with the skin ou. Throw them into the preserving kettle, and cook slowly all day, as with apple butter. Keep stirring to prevent from scorehing. Small and low priced peaches will do for this porpose.

SPICE NUTS .- One pint sugar house moasses, half-pound butter, half-pound sugar, quarter-pound ginger, one oz. coriander seed, a little powdered cinnamon, a small portion cloves and alspice; knead up as much flour as will make them tolerably stiff.

TO REMOVE SALT FROM PORK .-Take the pork from the brine, soak in sour milk a few hours; then put in cold water a short time, and the pork will be very nicely freshened.
