It concludes with a chapter on "Public Lands, how and where to get thein, shows the amount of unoccupied lands, how to obtain "irree larms," gives the location of the government land offices, describes the different classes of public lands and the several modes and cost of obtaining them under the nonnestead laws, by precention, &c., with suggestions as to the manner and cost of starting farms, when to conmence, what money can do, what pluck and muscle may do-wases, employment, and who should come to the State—affording, in short, all such information as emigrants most need.
