The present system of publishing the laws in pamphlet form, under the administration of the lowest bidder principle, as public printer, is such a mi-crable farce that it is hardly worth condemning. In the first place, the typographical execution of the pamphlets would entitle them only to a place among the refuse matter of a printing office. In the early days of England, the primitive Saxons were wont to send messengers among the people to read the laws to them, immediately after their being enacted by the wittenagenete, or meeting of wise men; it being then deemed essential that the fore they were expected to be amonable to them. The improved plan of modern days is to keep the knowledge of laws in the persons of few, who are Attorney & Counselor at Law, as Pann.hlet Laws.

While Caligula was at the head of the Roman Empire, the Senate ordered the laws to be written out and placed by the road-ide, that the people might read them ; but that tyrant effectually annulled that order by putting them on posts so high that the people could not see them. Pennsylvania Legislatures, though unconsciously, produce the same results in counties not contiguous to the Capital.

Now, the question arises, after contemplating this state of facts, is there a remody ! We think there is; and without entering into detailed specifitration, we would suggest the plan of having the laws published in one or more newspapers in each county, prior to the time appointed for their taking [effect-excepting special acts requiringimm. diate enforcement. Of course we would be understood as implying that publishers should be furnished with certified copies, by the properauthorities. Then, make such publieation sufficient evidence in the different logal tribunals, of the existence of Baid laws We are not authorized to speak for the fraternity of country editors, but we venture to say they would insert the laws of the Commonwealth in their portion of their readers, besides being of practical benefit .-- Highland Patriot.
