THE undersigned citizens of Harrison having associated themselves together for religious purposes, do hereby respectfully ask your honorable body to grant them a charter of incorporation to enable them to hold a meeting house in the town of Harrison, Potter Co., Pa., for the use of the First Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Harrison. The following are the articles of association: Article 1. The name of the association shall be the First Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Harrison. Article 2.
