That it shall be the duty of the supervisors, on or before the first day of June of each year, so file their duplicate for so much of the tax assessed upon unseated lands, in pursuance of the foregoing sections of this act, as shall at that time remain due and unpaid, in the office of the County Commissioners for collection; when the said duplicate shall have been filed as aforesaid, the county Commissioners are hereby authorized and required to draw their orders on the county treasurer, in favor of the supervisors of the proper townships, in sums as may be desired by them, to the amount of such duplicate, deducting therefrom such amount as will, in the judgment of the county commissioners, be sufficient to pay the commission of the county treasurer, and cover such exonerations and abatements as will be likely to be made, and shall deliver the same to the township treasurer; the said duplicate, when so filed, shall be collected by the county treasurer, as is provided by law for the collection of other taxes on unseated lands, and the tax so collect by the county commissioners.
