**Resolution**

Proposing Amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania...

**ARTICLE XI. OF PUBLIC DEBTS.**

Sec. 1. The state may contract debts, to supply casual deficits or contingencies in revenues...

Sec. 2. In addition to the above limited power the state may contract debts to repay or to discharge any debt...

Sec. 3. Except the debts above specified, no sections one and two of this article, no debt whatever shall be created by, or on behalf of the state.

Sec. 4. To provide for the payment of the present debt, and any additional debt contracted as aforesaid, the legislature shall, at its first session, after the adoption of this amendment, create a sinking fund...

Sec. 5. The credit of the commonwealth shall not, in any manner, or even, be pledged or loaned to, or any individual, corporation, or association...

Sec. 6. The commonwealth shall not assume the debt, or any part thereof, of any county, city, borough, or township...

Sec. 7. The legislature shall not authorize any corporation, or any individual, or any citizen, or otherwise, to become a stockholder in any company, association, or corporation...

**ARTICLE XII. OF NEW COUNTIES.**

No county shall be divided by a line cutting off over one-tenth of its population...

**THIRD AMENDMENT.**

From section two of the first article of the constitution, strike out the words, "of the city of Philadelphia, and of each county respectively..."

Sec. 1. In the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in every seventh year thereafter, representatives to the number of one hundred, shall be appointed...

At the end of section seven, same article, insert these words, "the city of Philadelphia shall be divided into single senatorial districts, of contiguous territory as nearly equal in taxable population as possible; but no ward shall be divided in the formation thereof..."

The legislature, at its first session, after the adoption of this amendment, shall divide the city of Philadelphia into senatorial and representative districts...
