Newspaper Postage. We give below the new regulations in regard to postage on papers and other publications, that seem to be the result of the repeal of the franking privilege:

The new postal regulations in regard to newspapers, periodicals, etc., go into effect on the 1st of July. These regulations provide that all newspapers, periodicals, etc., sent by mail must be prepaid by stamps unless "regularly issued and sent to regular subscribers" by publishers or news dealers, when the following rates per quarter are charged, payable in advance, either at the mailing or delivery office:

Dailies 35 cts. Six times a week 25 " Tri-weekly 15 " Semi-weeklies 10 " Weeklies 5 " Semi-monthlies, not over 4 ozs. 6 " Monthlies, not over 4 ozs. 3 " Quarterlies, not over 4 ozs. 1 "

This law will exclude all exchanges between publishers and weekly newspapers which are printed in the county where delivered, from free circulation. Newspapers and periodicals dropped in to the local office for delivery must be prepaid at the rate of one cent for two ounces or fraction thereof; and periodicals weighing more than two ounces are subject to two cents, prepaid at the letter-carrier office. The postage on regular papers, etc., must be paid in advance at the place of delivery, to the carrier or at the office; otherwise they will be chargeable at exorbitant rates.—Gazette & Bulletin.

New Laws. The Legislature last winter increased the pay of jurors to ten dollars per day. It also passed a law relating to legal holidays, which we insert below in full:

Sec. 1.—Be it enacted, etc., that the following days, namely, first day of January, twenty-second day of February, fourth day of July, twenty-fifth day of December and any other day appointed or recommended by the Governor of this State, and the first day of the month of fasting or thanksgiving, or for the general cessation of business, shall be regarded as legal holidays and shall, for all purposes whatsoever, as regards the presenting for payment or of acceptance of any bill of exchange, or the giving notice of the dishonor of bills of exchange, bank checks, drafts and promissory notes made after the passage of this act, be treated and considered as the first day of the week commonly called Sunday.

Sec. 2.—Whenever the first day of January, twenty-second day of February, fourth day of July or twenty-fifth day of December, shall, either of them, occur on Sunday, the following day, Monday, shall be deemed and declared a public holiday, and all bills of exchange, bank checks, drafts and promissory notes falling due on either of the Mondays so observed as a holiday, shall be due and payable on the Saturday preceding such holidays; and such Mondays, so observed, shall, for all purposes whatsoever as regards the presenting for payment or of acceptance of any bill of exchange, or the giving notice of the dishonor of bills of exchange, bank checks, drafts and promissory notes made after the passage of this act, be treated and considered as the first day of the week commonly called Sunday.

Sec. 3.—Nothing in this act shall prevent the making or demand of any promissory note, draft, checks and bills of exchange, falling due on said Mondays, that are observed as holidays, on the day upon which such bills, checks, drafts, checks and promissory notes shall be due.
