

**A NEW GOLD COIN.**—Senator Gwinn, of California, has introduced a rather novel but national idea relative to a larger denomination of gold coin. He proposes, by a bill introduced in the United States Senate by him, to authorize the coinage of \$100, \$50 and \$25 pieces, the first to be called the *Union*, the second a *Half Union* and the third a *Quarter Union*. His objects to furnish a circulating medium which will supply the wants of the people in California, where they have no banks for paper currency.
